Stop bloodshed in road accidents; Tony appeals to DGP Dilbag

TT CORRESPONDENT JAMMU, NOV. 14: Showing extreme level of concern over the rising number of fatal accidents in the Union Territory especially on National Highway axis and in Doda and Kishtwar, DDC Member Suchetgarh, Taranjit Singh Tony on Sunday appealed to the DGP Dilbag Singh to take necessary action in stopping the bloodshed on roads.

In a statement issued here, the DDC member said that as per estimate the lives lost in road accidents are far more than toll taken by the three-decade old terrorism in J&K. He urged DGP Dilbag to take some extraordinary measures to contain the number of road mishaps as loss of life has crossed all the previous records. He expressed surprise that despite the good quality of roads and improved vehicle engineering the ratio of accidents on roads is increasing with each passing day. He said that police should focus on this aspect and do whatever

possible to stop bloodshed on roads as this is vital because density of vehicles on roads especially the national highways is increasing day by day and if immediate steps will not be taken then the things can become precarious and chances are there that the same can go out of control.

The DDC member asserted that the DGP should take personal initiative to look into the functioning of management of National Highway especially the hilly terrain. "It's almost on daily basis that J&K is losing precious lives in road accidents and going by the record, the road accidents have seen unprecedented increase in last few years, which is matter of grave concern", he said, adding that today only two persons have lost their lives in an accident in Ramban which could have been avoided if things were taken on war footing and functioning of road management was regulated in a better way. Tony also appealed

to the IGP Traffic to conduct traffic rules awareness camps in collaboration with RTOs of concerned districts and also organize these camps in higher secondary schools, colleges and universities to disseminate information in the right way. He also demanded that Jammu District should at least have two RTOs one for Rural and other for Jammu City considering the huge chunk of population currently dependent on the lone RTO office.

Tony emphasized that international standards should be adopted while issuing the driving licenses and the punching system should be introduced in letter and spirit to teach habitual offenders a befitting lesson. He alleged that corruption in the Traffic Department is also one of the reasons behind unfortunate incidents on the roads therefore a fool-proof mechanism should be adopted by the anti-graft bodies of the UT so that no one dares to take things lightly as this is the matter of life and death.
