Gupta condemns Pahalgam Terror Attack, Calls for United

Stand Against Terrorism <u>TT CORRESPONDENT</u> JAMMU, APR. 24: Sham Lal Gupta, Chairman of Anti-Crime (VICO) has strongly and amount the (NĜO), has strongly condemned the barbaric terrorist attack on tourists in the Baisaran area of Pahalgam, Anantnag district, in which 26 innocent lives were lost and dozens more were injured. He described the act as cowardly and inhuman, aimed at disrupting the growing atmosphere of peace and harmony in Jammu and Kashmir.

Expressing deep anguish over the heinous incident, Gupta said such acts of terror reflect the desperation of those who cannot tolerate the return of normalcy, tourism, and sta-bility in the Union Territory. 'Attacking unarmed civilians who had come to enjoy the natural beauty and cultural warmth of Kashmir is a shameful and despicable act," he stated. "These attempts to tarnish the image of Jammu and Kashmir must be condemned by every right-thinking citizen."

He further emphasized that the people of Jammu and Kashmir have repeatedly voiced their aspiration for peace, development, and brotherhood-an aspiration that terrorists are trying to sabotage. "The enemies of peace are trying to instill fear among tourists and local communities.
