

Operation Sindoor...

He praised the Indian Armed Forces for the successful execution of Operation Sindoor and highlighted that Pakistan was compelled to plead for a halt to the conflict. The Prime Minister also emphasised that Operation Sindoor is still ongoing.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Friday laid the foundation stone for development and defence-related projects worth approximately ₹47,600 crore during his visit to Kanpur, Uttar Pradesh. Addressing a large public gathering, the Prime Minister said that the visit, initially scheduled for April 24, was postponed following the terrorist attacks in Pahalgam. Paying tribute to Shubham Dwivedi, a resident of Kanpur who lost his life in the attack, the Prime Minister said the entire nation shares the sorrow and anguish of the victims. He also highlighted the success of Operation Sindoor, launched in response to the attacks, noting that the Indian armed forces destroyed terrorist hide-outs in Pakistan and forced the adversary to plead for de-escalation.Reaffirming India's stance against terrorism, the Prime Minister said, "Our response will be decisive. The timing and nature of our actions will be determined solely by our forces. India will no longer tolerate nuclear blackmail or make distinctions between state and non-state actors in Pakistan." He added that Operation Sindoor is not yet over, and India will eliminate threats wherever they exist.Highlighting the strength of indigenous defence capabilities, PM Modi said Operation Sindoor showcased the impact of 'Make in India', with domestically produced weapons like the BrahMos missile hitting targets with precision. He reiterated the government's commitment to making India self-reliant in defence, stating that the era of dependence on foreign countries for military needs is ending.He also pointed to the major role Uttar Pradesh is playing in this transformation, noting that seven historic ordnance factories, including the one in Kanpur, have now been converted into advanced defence production units.

"More than 9,500 bunkers have been built so far, which played a crucial role in saving lives in the last three days," he said. He added that the Government of India, in coordination with the UT administration, will build more bunkers in the coming days to further enhance civilian protection in border areas. Standing firmly with the residents of the border region, Shah said, "The entire nation and the governments of India and Jammu and Kashmir stand with you like a rock. The acts committed by terrorists and Pakistan will only make India's defence policy stronger."

Reiterating Prime Minister Modi's firm stance on terrorism, Shah asserted, "Terror and talks cannot go together. Terror and trade cannot go together. Blood and water cannot flow together."

Stressing on peace and progress, Shah said, "I assure the people of Jammu and Kashmir that the development that began in 2014 will resume with full force. Anyone who tries to disrupt it will be given a powerful and befitting reply." The Union home minister said that Pakistan committed a "highly condemnable act" by carrying out intense shelling in border areas of Jammu and Kashmir, particularly in Poonch, and asserted that India responded by precisely targeting terror infrastructure across the border without harming any civilians. Calling the recent shelling "the worst in Poonch since Independence," Shah said civilian homes, temples, gurudwaras, and mosques were targeted by Pakistan. "This is a highly condemnable act. Pakistan used civilians as human shields. Only after this provocation, our forces responded with strength and precision. Shah visited the affected region to express solidarity and announced that a special relief package would soon be introduced by the Centre for damaged homes, businesses, and religious sites. "We have already provided appointment

letters to the families of those who lost their loved ones in the attack. This can never compensate for the loss, but it is a step in sharing their burden," he said. Lauding the swift response of the administration and security forces, Shah said, "Even senior officers made sacrifices. The LG, administration, and police worked tirelessly to evacuate residents from shelling zones and ensure safety."

Congress insulted nation by equating MPs with terrorists: Kavinder

Says BJP committed to expose Pakistan's duplicity on global stage

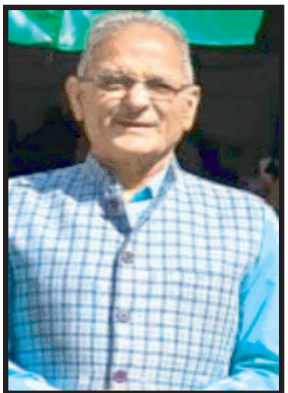
Jammu, May 30 : Senior BJP leader and former Deputy Chief Minister, Kavinder Gupta has strongly condemned the Congress party for equating Members of Parliament, currently on an international mission as part of Operation Sindoor to expose Pakistan's terror agenda, with terrorists. Terming the remarks "highly irresponsible and disgraceful," he demanded strict action and an unconditional apology from the Congress leadership.

Reacting sharply to Congress leader Jairam Ramesh's controversial statement — wherein he likened the elected MPs participating in all-party delegations abroad to ter-

rorists — Kavinder said, "It is shocking and utterly shameful that a senior leader of a national party has stooped so low as to draw such outrageous comparisons. These MPs are representing India's interests on foreign soil, unmasking Pakistan's state-sponsored terrorism, and yet the Congress finds fault in their patriotism."

"Kavinder asserted that such statements insult the democratic mandate of the elected representatives. "This isn't just an insult to the MPs — it's an insult to the people of India who sent them to Parliament. Equating them with terrorists is not just slanderous, it borders on anti-national

rhetoric," he added.He further accused the Congress of playing petty politics at



the cost of national interest, urging the party to clarify its stand on India's fight against terrorism. "Congress must make it

clear whether they stand with India or with the narrative being pushed by Pakistan," he said.Calling for strict action, Kavinder appealed to the Speaker of the Lok Sabha and the Election Commission to take cognizance of the statement. "We cannot allow such reckless remarks to go unchecked. There must be accountability for language that demeans national duty and endangers India's global standing."The former deputy Chief Minister reaffirmed the BJP's commitment to exposing Pakistan's duplicity on the global stage and standing united in defense of India's sovereignty and dignity.

ADVISORY FOR FOOD BUSINESS OPERATORS /
Consumers ON ARTIFICIAL FRUIT RIPENING

Fruit ripening is a combination of physiological, biochemical and molecular processes which makes the fruit edible, palatable and nutritious. It happens naturally and may also be induced or controlled. According to the ripening pattern, fruits are classified into two categories, viz.

- 1. Non-climacteric Fruits: Fruits which are usually harvested after ripening and full maturity, such as Lemon, Orange, Grape, Cherry, Pineapple etc.**
- 2. Climacteric Fruits: Fruits which are harvested at full maturity and can be further ripened during transit or storage like Banana, Guava, Avocado, Mango, Apple, Pear, Apricot, Peach and Tomato etc.**

Artificial ripening is the process by which ripening is controlled to achieve desired characteristics intended for better consumer acceptance. Fruit trade involves transporting fruits to distant places. Highly perishable fruits such as mango, papaya, banana, etc. cannot be stored and transported to long distances after ripening as they tend to spoil. Therefore, to avoid spoilage of fruit during transportation, traders generally harvest raw fruits and ripen them artificially at the destination market before sale.

Considering the issue of use of banned calcium carbide and non-availability of alternative ripening agent, Food Safety & Standards Authority of India (FSSAI) permitted the use of ethylene gas for ripening of fruits in India vide notification dated 23.08.2016, subject to adherence to the SoPs by the Food Business Operators (FBOs).

A detailed SoP for use of Ethylene gas for artificial ripening has been notified by FSSAI and available at the official website <https://fssai.gov.in/cms/guidance-notes.php>.

Accordingly, all the FBOs dealing with storage/packaging/distribution/ sale of Fruits & Vegetables are advised to strictly adhere to the following guidelines during and post artificial ripening treatment to ensure safe and compliant ripening practices , falling which penal action as warranted under FSS Act2006 shall be initiated :

- 1. CARBIDE GAS OR ACETYLENE GAS: - Artificial Ripening with Calcium Carbide, popularly known as 'Masala' has been strictly banned in terms of sub-regulation 2.3.5 of Food Safety & Standards (Prohibition and Restrictions on Sales) Regulation, 2011, due to its potential health hazards.**
- 2. Ethylene Gas: Ethylene is a hormone produced naturally within the fruits to stimulate ripening process. Ethylene, being a natural hormone does not pose any health hazard to consumers.**
 - a. Ethylene gas, ethanol, ethephon, etc. can be used on fruits to trigger the ripening process in fruits, under controlled conditions of Humidity, Temperature and Exposure Time.**
 - b. Any source of ethylene gas coming in direct contact with fruits is not permitted.**
 - c. Only approved source of Ethylene Gas is allowed to be procured and used, besides ensuring authenticity/purity of the sachets containing ethephon in powdered form and other components.**
 - d. Only those sachets must be used that are properly labelled mentioning details of manufacturer, composition, instructions for use etc.**
 - e. Use Ethylene Gas for artificial ripening can be done upto the concentration of 100 ppm (100 µl/L) only.**
 - f. Fruit should not occupy more than 75% of the volume of the chamber (as well as crate) during the treatment.**
 - g. Gas leakage monitoring system should be installed in the commercial ripening chambers.**
 - h. Stacking of boxes should be done keeping minimum 4-6 inches space from the walls and between the adjacent crates.**

Consumers also are advised to remain vigilant in the market and purchase fruits from known sellers/reputed stores/dealers who declare that fruits sold have not been ripened using harmful/banned chemicals and to wash fruits thoroughly with potable water before its use/consumption to ensure its safety and quality.
