Senior BJP leader and former Deputy Chief Minister, Kavinder Gupta on Sunday came down heavily on those involved in aiding and abetting terrorism, asserting that India will neither forget nor forgive such betrayals against the nation.

Reacting strongly to the recent arrests made by the National Investigation Agency (NIA) for providing shelter and logistical support to Pakistani Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT) terrorists responsible for the April 22 terror attack in Pahalgam—which claimed 26 lives and left 16 injured—the BJP stalwart lauded the security forces for their swift and decisive action in exposing the local facilitators of terror.

"Providing shelter, food, and logistical support to foreign terrorists is a direct act of war against our country. Such individuals must face the full force of the law," he asserted in a statement issued here today.
