The lecture was delivered by Prof. Rajender Singh Sangwan, Vice-Chancellor, Raffles University, Rajasthan and Former Director/Vice Chancellor, Agree of Scientific and Director/Vice-Chancellor, Academy of Scientific and Innovative Research (AcSIR), on the topic "Biochemistry and Bio-manufacturing of D-Allulose: The Table Sugar of the Future for a Healthy World." Prof. Sangwan, a renowned scientist in biochemical sciences and biotechnology, provided an in-depth analysis of the biochemistry of sugars, tracing the his-torical development of table sugar and artificial sweeteners, and examining their impact on human health. He introduced D-Allulose, a rare sugar with minimal calorific value and immense potential as a natural, safe, and diabetic-friendly sweetener, widely regarded as "the table sugar of the future." The lecture further explored the bio-manufacturing process of D-Allulose from fructose, emphasizing sustainable and cost-effective approaches that utilise agricultural waste. This aligns with global efforts toward circular bio-economy, waste valorisation, and environmental

friendly production technologies.

Prof. Sanjay Guleria, Dean, Faculty of Basic Sciences, hosted the session and welcomed the distinguished speaker. He emphasized the increasing releguisned speaker. He emphasized the increasing relevance of green bioprocessing, nutraceuticals, and functional foods in agriculture and health sciences. The lecture was coordinated by Dr. Vinod Kumar, Associate Professor, Division of Biochemistry.

JAMMU, JULY 12: Arun Prabhat, state president Bharatiya Janata Yuva Morcha, along with hundreds of youth held a massive protest march from Kachi chawni and gheraoed the JKSSB head office in Jammu. During his address he cautioned the current Omar Abdullah led state government of intense agitation if the discriminatory decision of imposing urdu in naib tehsildar's recruitment has not been taken back. It has been more than a month the youth is protesting on the roads but there is not a statement from the government or any competent authority. This adamant attitude of the government depicts their policy of intentional exclusivity to a particular region. Omar Abdullah or his cabinet ministers who represent Jammu in the government has to break the silence and clear their stance on this discriminatory policy otherwise next gherao will be of Civil Secretariat and chief

He described this recruitment as unconstitutional as it violates the very core of fundamental rights of getting equal opportunity in public employment. How can the government justify itself by barring 70% of subjects from this naib tehsildar's recruitment. Urdu in revenue matters and NT exam in particular is a well intended conspiracy to keep Jammu division in dark-

In his concluding remarks he gave a call to all the aspirants and people of Jammu Kashmir to come forward against this discriminatory recruitment policy of the NC led government. Furthermore he urged the aspirants of non urdu background to apply for the post of Naib Tehsildar's recruitment as BJP will fight for heir rights at any cost until justice is delivered.

# EPG raises alarm over illegal garbage dumping near 252-million-year-old Fossil Park at Guryul Ravine

The Environmental Policy
Group (EPG) expresses
serious concern and deep
anguish over the establishment of a large illegal garbage dumping yard near the Guryul Ravine Fossil Park located at Khonmoh, on the outskirts of Srinagar. The act not only constitutes a grave ecological violation but also endangers a globally significant geo-heritage site that dates back 252 million years. Of critical scientific importance, the site is the only known geological formation that preserves definitive evidence of the world's first recorded tsunami, embedded within its ancient sedimentary layers.

The Guryul Ravine is globally acknowledged by geologists, palaeontologists, and climate scientists as one of the most impor-Permian-Triassic boundary sites in the

Guryul Ravine offers a rare glimpse into the ecological collapse and recovery phases that followed the extinction. It serves as a natural laboratory for studying Earth's climate history, mass extinctions, tectonic activity, and evo-

lutionary processes.
What makes Guryul
Ravine particularly unique is the presence of tsunamigenerated sedimentary structures, identified and documented by geoscientists, that confirm the earliest evidence of a massive oceanic disturbance triggered during the Permian-Triassic transition. These findings have been cited in international scientific journals and attract global research interest, making the site not only a national but also a world heritage

The establishment of a waste dumping ground in such close proximity to this ecologically and scientifically sensitive area is a shocking act of environmental vandalism. It directly violates several key environmental protec-tion laws, including the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986, the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972, and the Solid Waste Management Rules. 2016. More significantly, it disre-Waste gards the binding directions of the Hon'ble High Court of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh, which had earlier directed the conservation of such

sensitive and heritage-rich zones. Significantly, strong disapproval of the mining activities in and around this site were made by Internationally renowned Geo-scientists following Government on the directions of the Prime Minister of India completely banned mining and other

activities in and around

Fossil Park. However, despite that officials have

chosen to vandalise the site by enclosing a huge area as a garbage dumping site and constructing a garbage shed.

Environmental Policy Group is dismayed that despite repeated warnings and appeals over the years, this globally important site remains neglected, unprotected, and now under threat of irreversible demage. The illegal dump damage. The illegal dumping poses an immediate risk to the fossil beds, frag-ile sedimentary layers, and the overall ecological balance of the region. If not stopped, this negligence could destroy one of the few remaining accessible records of Earth's most dramatic evolutionary

EPG calls upon all concerned departments and authorities, including the Jammu and Kashmir Pollution Committee, the District Administration Srinagar, Department

Geology and Mining, the Department of Wildlife Protection, and the Department of Rural Development, to immediately take cognisance of this illegal act. The dumping site must be dismantled without any delay, and stringent legal action must be taken against those responsible for this gross

violation of environmental

and court mandates.

Conservationists, researchers, legal experts, and civil society has expressed collective outrage at the violation of laws and disregard for a site of such unparalleled natural heritage. The Environmental Policy Group confirms that it will be filing a petition before the High Court once again to seek urgent intervention, enforcement of existing orders, and enhanced legal safeguards to protect the site from further degrada-

to the Lieutenant Governor of Jammu and Kashmir, Manoj Sinha, the Chief Minister, Omar Abdullah, and the Chief Secretary to intervene at the highest level and issue immediate directions for corrective action. The Group further requests that the Guryul Ravine Fossil Park and its surrounding buffer zone be officially declared as a No-Dumping Zone and noti-fied as an Eco-Sensitive Area under relevant provisions of environmental and

heritage protection law. Guryul Ravine is not merely a local landmark but a global geological monument of irreplaceable value. It is a living class-room for students, a research base for scientists, and a timeless reminder of the Earth's resilience.

# Civil Society Demands Transparency, Cardiac Emergency, Audit of Medical Referral Practices" Balvinder

Balvinder Singh renowned RTI Activist of the state while addressing the media persons stated that in a initiative to strengthen healthcare infrastructure in Jammu Province, the Government of India sanctioned the establishment of four new Government Medical Colleges (GMCs). GMC Rajouri was established in 2016, with its first batch of 100 MBBS students admitted in 2019. Singh recalled the promise made on 17th November 2013, when then Health & Family Welfare Minister Shri Ghulam Nabi Azad inaugurated the Super Speciality Hospital (SSH) gurated to end patients' arduous journeys to PGI and AIIMS for specialized care. Yet, that vision remains unfulfilled-many departments at SSH never became fully functional became fully functional, and sanctioned staff appointments were never made. Even today, Jammu lacks a dedicated Cardiac Emergency in SSH, forcing heart attack patients to visit GMC's Emergency before being shifted to SSH, losing the critical 'golden hour' in transit. Tragically, some precious human lives lost in this delay.

The foundation stones of GMC Doda and GMC Kathua were laid on 11th



J.P. Nadda, and the then Chief Minister, Ms. Mehbooba Mufti. Both institutions became operational in 2020. GMC Doda was intended to serve nearly 10 lakh residents of the erstwhile Doda districtcomprising Doda, Kishtwar, and Ramban-while GMC Kathua was envisioned to cater to remote and border areas such as Bani, Basholi, and Billawar. GMC Udhampur was established in 2023 to meet the growing demand for healthcare services and

Additionally, the All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS) Jammu was inaugurated by Hon'ble Prime Minister varenara 19th February 2024. It was projected as a transformative step to reduce dependency on Delhi for specialized treatment.

However, as highlighted by Mr. Balvinder Singh, despite these developments, the healthcare delivery system remains inadequate. Citing an RTI

June 2017 by the then response from GMC Union Health Minister, Sh. Jammu, he pointed out that Jammu, he pointed out that a significant number of patients continue to be referred to GMC Jammureferred to GMC Jammunot only from CHCs, PHCs, Sub District Hospital & District Hospital but also from the newly established GMCs of Rajouri, Kathua, Doda and Udhampur.

The referral data from January to May 2025

January to May 2025 received under RTI raises serious concerns about the operational readiness of these institutions. Mr. Singh attributed this troubling trend to the persistent absence of senior doctors in peripheral Government Medical Colleges, alleging that many are preoccupied with private practice, thereby leaving junior docwithout adequate supervision. Singh along with other civil Society members S Manjeet Singh Bali, Anil Nargotra, Mahinder Sharma, Mahesh Kotwal, S Manmohan Singh, S T.P Singh, S Harmohinder urged the Hon'ble Singh Chief Minister of the JKUT, Omar Abdullah,

and the Health Minister, Ms. Sakina Itoo, to implement the following corrective measures: Enforce a comprehensive prohibition on private clinical practice by Doctors serving in all Government Medical Colleges, to ensure fulltime commit, ment to institutional responsibilities; and the most important is To establish Cardiac Emergency at SSH Jammu. Introduce a policy for inter-district Medical Colleges transfers to ensure equitable deployment of medical professionals; Constitute a highlevel review committee comprising senior medical professionals and health administrators to conduct clinical audits of patient referrals, evaluate the appropriateness and medical justification of such referrals, and establish accountability mechanisms-particularly in cases of unwarranted referrals originating not only from District and Sub-District Hospitals but also from established Colleges.

Singh emphasized that unless these structural reforms are implemented with urgency, the mere establishment of new medical colleges will not fulfil the promise of accessible and quality healthcare for the people of Jammu Province.
