#### City of Toll Taxes: J&K Youth Congress **Slams BJP Over Toll Burden in Jammu** TT CORRESPONDENT

JAMMU, JULY 15 : In a strong joint statement, the Jammu and Kashmir Youth Congress leaders expressed deep concern over the rising number of toll plazas in the Jammu region, stating that the BJP-led central government has turned the city into a "City of Toll Taxes." The statement was undersigned by Vice President Adv. Ranjot Singh, General Secretary Anirudh Sawhney, General Secretary Happy Randhawa, Secretaries Akhil Bogia, Dr. Shohaib Manhas, Anmol Kohli, and Mehul Abrol.

"Jammu, once revered as the City of Temples, was gradually reduced to a City of Wine Shops - and now, under BJP's rule, it is fast becoming a City of Toll Taxes," Youth Congress leaders remarked disappointingly. The Youth Congress leaders condemned the rampant imposition of toll plazas across the region, calling it an attack on the common man's pocket. They stated that people are being forced to pay for poorly maintained roads, frequent traffic snarls, and highways that are far from world-class, all while the government claims development.

The leaders also criticized the utter silence of local BJP representatives on the long-standing demand to either roll back or rationalize toll collection. They pointed out that the BJP, which governs both the Centre and the Union Territory through the LG administration, has no one else to blame. The leaders questioned how BJP leaders could protest a system that is entirely controlled by their own party, both at the Centre and in the Union Territory. Toll taxes weren't imposed by the J&K government; they come under NHAI and are a direct result of central policies under BJP rule. Are they protesting against their own party then? If they are truly serious, they should protest in Delhi, not mislead people in Jammu with empty gestures," they said.

The Youth Congress leaders called on the government to immediately review the toll policy in Jammu and stop burdening residents for basic travel. "The people of Jammu deserve better. We need to look into affordable access and better infrastructure instead of financial exploitation and brutal taxation. The BJP's toll tax regime is unjust, excessive, and exploitative," he statement concluded.

Dr. Abhijeet Jasrotia added that the wall-jumping episode was nothing but a media stunt. He reminded the public of the 2010 unrest in which over 120 people died under Abdullah's watch as head of the Unified Command.
