## MLA Jasrotia expresses shock and sorrow over devastating cloudburst in Kathua District

TT CORRESPONDENT JASROTA, AUG. 17: MLA Jasrota, Rajiv Jasrotia, has expressed deep shock and sorrow over the devastating cloudburst that hit Jodh Ghati village in Kathua district, resulting in the loss of at least seven lives and injuring several others. Addressing media person over this unfortunate natural calamity after visiting the cloudburst-hit areas, witnessing firsthand the extent of the destruction and assessing the needs of the affected families, Jasrotia informed that the incident, which occurred late Saturday night, trig-gered landslides, flash floods, and large-scale disruption, causing wide-spread destruction and chaos. The cloudburst snapped access to Jodh Ghati village, where floodwaters swept through homes and agricultural fields, leaving families stranded. Several connecting roads were washed away, and a bridge collapsed, worsening the situation, added Jasrotia.

Jasrotia announced a compensation package from his Constituency Development Fund (CDF)



for the affected families, including Rs 1 lakh for fully damaged houses, Rs 50,000, for severely damaged houses and Rs 25,000 for partially damaged houses. Jasrotia informed that helicopter evacuations have been launched, and multiple agencies, including the Army, NDRF, SDRF, and police, are working tireless-ly to restore connectivity and assist victims.

Jasrotia urged the government to implement longterm flood protection measures, including improved embankments, real-time weather alerts, and a review of building norms in vulnerable areas.He said authorities are working to restore essential services, including power, water, and road links, to the affected

areas.Jasrotia appealed to the authorities to ensure that the rescue and relief operations are carried out with utmost speed and efficiency. He also emphasized the need for long-term measures to mitigate the impact of such disasters in the future.

While the state government has sought central assistance, Jasrotia urged long-term flood protection measures. This includes improved embankments, real-time weather alerts, and a review of building norms in vulnerable areas. # Bali Bhagat slams Kashmiri rulers for unrest in J & K, credits PM Modi for restoring normalcy

# TT CORRESPONDENT JAMMU, AUG. 17: Senior BJP leader and for-

mer Minister Bali Bhagat mer Minister Bail Bhagat launched a scathing attack on the past Kashmiri lead-ership, accusing them of playing a "double role" and failing to restore normalcy in Jammu and Kashmir during their rule during their rule.

Bali Bhagat said that the demand for restoration of statehood is being raised by the same Kashmiri leaders of Congress, NC and PDP who are themselves responsible for its loss, as their failure to control law and order, their double stan-dards, and soft approach towards separatists and terrorists pushed Jammu and Kashmir into turmoil.

Bali Bhagat said that when Jammu and Kashmir was a state, shutdowns were a routine feature from the 1990s till 2018 under the rule of leaders like Farooq Abdullah, Omar Abdullah, Mufti Mohammad Sayeed and Mehbooba Mufti, as these

leaders failed to control the

situation due to their soft

corner towards separatists and terrorists.

"However, after the abrogation of Article 370 and 35-A and the reorganisation of J&K into a Union Territory, shutdowns, stone pelting declined rapidly and normalcy was restored under the decisive leadership of the Narendra Modi-led Central Government," Bali Bhagat asserted.

Recalling the violent phase from June to September 2010 under the Omar Abdullah-led gov-Omar Abdullah-led government, Bhagat said that protesters, mostly youth, defied curfews, raised proindependence slogans, torched police vehicles, and attacked government buildings. "The unrest escalated to such an extent that as many as 117 people lost their lives in police lost their lives in police action during Omar Abdullah's regime," he said.

Targeting PDP chief Mehbooba Mufti, the BJP leader said that during her tenure as Chief Minister (2016-2018),civilian killings again shook the

Valley, especially after the encounter of terrorist Burhan Wani. "Over 100 deaths occurred including civilians and security per-sonnel, and near about 100 youths lost their eyesight due to pellet gun injuries," he stated. Bhagat also reminded that the PDP-BJP coalition government collapsed in June 2018 due to the worsening security situation, forcing Mehbooba

Mufti to resign. He said that all Kashmiri rulers-whether NC, PDP, and Congress failed to control the law-and-order situation and were responsible for the downgrading of Jammu and Kashmir to a Union Territory. "They played a double role and never worked honestly for peace. Even today, leaders like Farooq Abdullah repeat the old rhetoric of holding talks with Pakistan to end terrorism," Bhagat remarked.

The former minister further hit out at Congress leaders Saifuddin Soz and Tariq Hameed Karra for their controversial remarks on India's countermeasures against Pakistan after the Pahalgam attack. "Soz even went to the extent of saying that if Pakistan denies involvement, India should accept its word. This is the real mentality of such leaders," Bhagat alleged.

Crediting the Narendra Modi-led Central govern-ment for the present scenario, Bhagat said, "Civilian killings have completely stopped, barring two major terror attacks carried out by Pakistan-sponsored terrorists. The people of Jammu and Kashmir have witnessed an unexpected change at the ground level after the reorganisation of the state. Normalcy has been restored only due to decisive steps by the

Concluding his statement, Bhagat asserted that those Kashmiri leaders-Congress, NC, PDP, and separatists-had turned Kashmir into hell, while it was the Modi government that brought peace and stability to the region.

Although the relief and rescue operation is continuing in the disaster-hit area, 65 people have died so far in this tragedy and 70 people including children are still reported missing. Most of them are from Jammu, Samba and Kathua districts as most of the pilgrims were local residents of Jammu division. A CISF jawan is also among the missing people, while some people were from Haryana and Madhya Pradesh. The disaster struck Chisoti, the last motorable village on the way to the Machail Mata temple, at around 12.25 pm on August 14. It destroyed a makeshift market, a langar (commu-

nity kitchen) site for the yatra and a security checkpoint.

At least 16 residential houses and government buildings, three temples, four watermills, a 30metre-long bridge and over a dozen vehicles were also damaged in the flash

The annual Machail Mata Yatra, scheduled to begin on July 25 and end on September 5, was sus-pended. The 8.5-km trek to the 9,500-foot-high temple begins from Chisoti, located about 90 km from Kishtwar town. Rescue operations are continuing unabated with the civil administration deploying nearly a dozen earth-movers and the NDRF using specialised equipment and dog squads.

At the same time, Vikrant Kapoor also welcomed the announcement of Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha in which he said that he would ensure the reconstruction of houses damaged in the flash flood in Kishtwar.
