

DC Kathua reviews
arrangements for Navratra,
Dussehra festivals

KATHUA, SEPTEMBER 18 : Deputy Commissioner Kathua Rajesh Sharma on Thursday chaired a meeting of officers here at DC Office complex to review the arrangements for the Navratra and Dussehra festivals.

The meeting deliberated in detail, asking the stakeholder departments to formulate Actions Plan for

supply to all the shrines. The RTO was directed to keep a check on overloading and overcharging by the transporters on Yatra routes and to take action against the defaulters. The Traffic Police department was asked to ensure effective traffic regulation to prevent congestion during Navratra festival.

Responding to the issues raised by the Mandir



cleanliness, sanitation, drinking water, uninterrupted power supply, traffic regulation and checking of rates of eatables. The Police Department was asked to come out with a detailed deployment plan for ensuring security arrangements in and around the important temples and shrines of the district.

Stress was laid on maintaining security around important shrines and temples besides different venues of Dusherra festival. The Deputy Commissioner directed concerned PWD Engineers to start repair and renovation works at Mata Bala Sundri, Mata Sukrala, Doula Mata, Jasrota Mata, Jourian Mata shrines while the local BDOs were asked to repair bridge paths leading to the temples and shrines.

Similarly, the PDD Department was asked to make provision of additional transformers for Mata Jourian and Mata Bala Sundri Shrines to meet any contingency besides ensuring uninterrupted power

Committees, the DC assured timely repair of defunct high mast lights near all Temple Shrines.

The meeting formulated committees for regular inspection of the markets to keep check on single use plastic, quality of eatables and overcharging etc.

Earlier, the Members of management committees, priests of temples and shrines projected problems and demands. The Deputy Commissioner directed the concerned officers for immediate redressal of the same.

ADC Billawar, ADC Basohli and SDM Bani and SDM Hiranagar, joined the meeting virtually. They were also asked to ensure all logistic and other services for smooth observance of Navratra festival.

ADDC Surinder Mohan; CEO BBDA Atul Gupta; ADC Vishavjeet Singh; ADC Basohli Pankaj Bhagotra; CPO Ranjit Thakur; RTO and other officers of different departments were present in the meeting.

People are Facing Difficulties Due To
The Sidhra-Panjtirthi Road Being
One-Way : Hindustan Shiv Sena

Jammu, Sept 19 : Hindustan Shiv Sena State President Vikrant Kapoor has expressed deep concern over the difficulties faced by people due to the Siddara-Panjtirthi road being one-way. He has urged Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha to intervene in the matter and take immediate steps to open the road for two-way traffic. Addressing a press conference in Jammu Vikrant Kapoor said these words. He said that the road was closed due to a landslide caused by recent heavy rains on 26th august. He said that after some debris was removed, the road has been opened for one-way traffic. Debris remains on a 50-70 foot stretch of the road, but even after so many days, the debris has not been completely removed by JCB machines. Consequently, only one-way traffic is permitted on the road, causing significant inconvenience to general public.

Revival of Ujh project...

While interacting with the victims, Dr Jitendra Singh assured that compensation would be provided for damages suffered by their houses and shops. Deputy Commissioner, Pathankot, Aditya Uppal briefed Dr Jitendra Singh about the spots he visited today. He informed that 250 houses were reported to be severally or partially damaged during floods near Bridge Number 4 in Sujampur. He said the exact assessment is underway. Approximately, crop damage has been reported over 7 acre land. About 1500 people were affected. However, there were no casualties in Sujampur. More than 700 persons were rescued by NDRF, Police and the Army. The Deputy Commissioner also informed the Union Minister that about 200 people were affected in Pangoli where 25 houses belonging to SC community were severally damaged. Approximately, 6 acre crop land was swept away in khad water overflowing adjoining India Oil Petrol Pump towards Mamoon Cantt.

Yesterday, the Union Minister had visited several villages affected by the floods, such as Polla, Kohlian and the river bed of Ravi. Besides, he also visited places along the rivers Ravi and Jiali in Bamial, Chal, Amir, Simbal Sakol, Dhinda and Bhupalpur. On the occasion, the Union Minister was briefed on the level of damage suffered during the calamity. Dr Jitendra Singh said, Prime Minister Narendra Modi is monitoring the rehabilitation of the victims and reconstruction work with respect to the damaged infrastructure. The Minister said he is also monitoring the work being undertaken in all 23 districts of Punjab, and receives reports from the local authorities on a daily basis.

Farmers acquainted with modern
Horticulture Techniques

JAMMU, SEPTEMBER 18 : Department of Horticulture Jammu organized a Training / Exposure Visit for farmers of Jammu District to Akhnoor to acquaint them with new techniques and innovations in the Horticulture Sector. The visit was organised under Mission for Integrated Development of Horticulture (MIDH) and ATMA.

Director Horticulture Jammu Gul Sayed, Chief Horticulture Officer Rakesh Kotwal, Chief Scientist KVK, R.S.Pura, Dr. Ravneet Kour, District Level SMS Rakesh Kumar Bhagat and other officials of Horticulture Department were also present at the event.

The Programme drew a large number of farmers including former Sarpanches, Lambardars

and progressive orchardists from the area. The huge turnout reflected the keen interest among the local

(HADP), the Mission for Integrated Development of Horticulture (MIDH) and other Centrally Sponsored



farming community to adopt modern practices and value addition techniques in the Horticulture Sector.

Interacting with the farmers, the Director acquainted them about the Government schemes launched for Horticulture Development. He highlighted the benefits offered under Holistic Agriculture Development Programme

Schemes. He also assured full support from the department for enhancing capacity building of orchardists through training and workshops.

The Chief Horticulture Officer stressed the importance of skill based trainings and practical exposure for empowering farmers

District Level SMS also provided valuable technical

guidance to the orchardists on best Horticulture practices, emphasizing plants propagation methods and effective pests and disease control.

Later, the Director visited the High Density orchards, Demonstration Plots and Mulching component units where farmers were shown practical aspects of better Orchard Management, High Density Plantation techniques and benefits of mulching in conserving soil moisture, suppressing weeds and improving crop productivity.

Technical experts from the department delivered comprehensive demonstrations on Canopy management, integrated pest and disease management, irrigation practices, nutrient management and Post Harvest handling of fruits.

Training on Incident Response
System held for District Kathua

KATHUA, SEPTEMBER 18 : A virtual training programme on Incident Response System (IRS) was today conducted for District Kathua by the Department of Disaster Management, Relief, Rehabilitation & Reconstruction (DMRR&R) through Brig. Kuldip Singh (Retd) as the resource person.

The training aimed at sensitizing officers about the structured framework of IRS for effective disaster management, ensuring a coordinated approach by all line departments during emergencies.

Brig. Kuldip Singh (Retd) shared detailed insights on the concept, objectives and functioning of the Incident Response System, highlighting the

importance of establishing a clear chain of command, role clarity and efficient resource mobilization during crisis situations. He also explained how the system provides uniformi-

ty in response, reduces duplication of efforts and ensures optimum use of resources.

The participants were apprised about the responsibilities of Incident

Commanders and other designated officers, the need for inter-departmental coordination and the use of IRS in handling both natural and man-made disasters.
